#### **School Statement:**

### Arts Course Description/ Overview:

#### Materials Needed For Art Class:

Washable markers, colored pencils, hand held sharpener, pencils & extra eraser, flexible ruler, scissors, glue sticks, 1 pack white copy paper, zipper pouch to keep all supplies in and store in your book bag

Please keep your supplies in a zipper pouch or plastic zip bag with your name on everything in permanent marker.

Instructional Method: Any textbook and vocabulary will be assigned to correlate with the standards of this course. Handouts will be provided as needed. Topics will be introduced through lectures, discussions, and hands-on activities in order to meet the need of every child. Small and large groups will also be used to assist each student. The final grade for this class will be given on the basis of the degree and quality of the following:

- Bellwork
- Daily Art Assignment
- Major Art Projects

- Exams
- Group Work

#### Missed Work:

If a student is absent, the deadline for missed work is equal to the number of days missed plus one day. It is the student's responsibility to find out what assignments he/she has missed upon returning to school. If a child fails to turn in an assignment, he/she will receive morning or lunch detention to complete the assignment.

All assignments that practice skills are classified as <u>daily grades</u>. All exit tickets are classified as daily grades. All final projects that test the student's skills that we have practiced are classified as <u>test grades</u>.

For example: A student completes a value scale chart practicing their shading technique = practice/ daily grade. A student completes a still life that shows value shading using 3 techniques, use of 2 pairs complimentary colors = final project/ test grade.

**Parental Involvement:** Please ensure that your child does his best in Art by coming to class prepared with the necessary supplies that are listed under the Materials Needed heading above.

#### Classroom Norms

## Daily Classroom Procedures

- Enter and exit the classroom in an orderly manner. You will exit by rows daily and pick up all trash off the floor before leaving.
- Sharpen your pencil before class starts.
- If you are not at the pencil sharpener when the bell sounds, you should be in your seat.
- Have your bellwork and pencils/pens on the desk before the class begins.
- All drawing assignments must be drawn in pencil.
- Check the **Falcon's Nest** for the "Bell Work" activity each day and start as soon as possible. It is a timed activity (5-8 minutes).
- Sign all artwork on the bottom corner. Work turned in without a signature is considered incomplete.
- Bellwork will be taken up by the teacher as needed. The daily assignment will be handed to the teacher as you exit the room. Do not for any reason place your work on Mrs. Martin's desk.
- If you are absent due to an illness or a school function, you are responsible for obtaining your assignments before or after you return. There will be no exceptions.
- Do not leave the classroom without the teacher's permission and a hall pass.
- The quiet signal for my class is when I raise my right hand.
- When you go to the library, restroom, or cafeteria, walk to the right side of the hallway. Please use your quietest voice.
- Students are to follow all school wide norms and procedures including (but not limited to) dress code, proper use of electronic devices, positive social interaction, restroom policy, etc.
