

  enrolled/earned credit for DC Comp I and/or DC College Algebra

Dual Enrollment is college classes taken on GHS campus taught by our teachers.

To sign up today, students must <u>currently</u> have an 18 on the ACT and a 3.0 GPA to enroll in DC Art Appreciation.

In addition to a 3.0 GPA, you must have a subscore of 17 in English for DC Comp I/II and a subscore of 19 in Math for DC College Algebra/Trigonometry. Do not sign up for Dual Enrollment classes unless you are currently eligible.

If you are not currently eligible but become eligible by May 23, 2025, please provide written parental permission to your counselor to adjust your choice sheet.


