ENROLLMENT

COMPULSORY AGE/ATTENDANCE

"Compulsory school age child" means a child who attained or will attain the age of 6 years on or before September 1 of the calendar year the child wishes to enroll in first grade. Kindergarten attendance is not compulsory; but in accordance with Miss. Code Ann. Section 37-13-91, students who attain the age of 5 years on or before September 1 of the calendar year may attend kindergarten in the District. If a compulsory school age child has not been enrolled in a school within fifteen (15) calendar days after the first day of the school year, or such child is habitually absent without excuse, the principal or designee shall report the child to the school attendance officer of the youth court or family court for investigation.

DEFINITION OF RESIDENCY

Definition of "residency" for school attendance purposes: The student and the parent/guardian physically reside full time, week days, week nights and weekends, at a dwelling located within the boundaries of Madison County Schools. The school district administrative staff will verify the residence of each student.

Residency requirements are strictly enforced. The residency requirements outlined below are minimum requirements. The District reserves the right to require additional documentation and verification at any time.

Principals are empowered by the Board of Education to determine at any time that a child is <u>not</u> legally enrolled and may not attend classes.

DOCUMENTATION

A parent or legal guardian must accompany each student seeking to enroll in the District. No student will be officially enrolled in the Madison County School District until all of the following requirements have been fully satisfied.

- Present proof of residency within the Madison County School District;
- Present a certified birth certificate (not a copy);
- · Present a certified court order of guardianship when enrolling a student as his/her legal guardian;
- Present a certificate of health compliance (immunization form) issued by the Mississippi Department
 of Health or a local physician as required by Mississippi law;

In an effort to properly prepare middle and high school students to take standardized testing mandated by both the state and federal governments, the District requires middle and high school students take a comprehensive exam in carnegle credit bearing courses at the end of each semester. These exams will count as a major grade and will be weighted accordingly. First and second term grades will be averaged to compute a 1st semester grade. The third and fourth term grades will be averaged to compute the 2st semester grade.

- The 1st semester cumulative exam = 20% of the semester grade
- The 2nd semester cumulative exam = 20% of the semester grade
- The final average = 1st semester average + 2st semester average divided by two

If the method of arriving at grades varies, it will be clearly stated at the beginning of the term to the student and parent.

HONOR ROLL

The District recognizes two types of honor rolls:

- The "A, B" honor roll shall be composed of all students with grades no lower than 80/B.
- The "All A" honor roll shall be composed of all students with grades no lower than 90/A.

Dear Parent or Guardian of a K-8 Virtual Learner.

Students in Mississippi public schools are required to take certain state assessments based on their grade level. Two of these assessments occur at the beginning of the school year and are required under state law through the Literacy Based Promotion Act (https://www.mdek12.org/OSA/MKAS2).

- 1. K-Readiness Assessment for Kindergarten students
 - a. On student's district-issued iPad (fully charged)
 - b. With student's personal earbuds/headphones
- NWEA MAP Growth Universal Academic Screener in Reading and Math for Kindergarten through 8th grade students
 - a. On student's district-issued iPad for K-1st grade or on student's district-issued Chromebook for 2nd grade-8th grade (fully charged)
 - b. With student's personal earbuds/headphones (K-1st grade only)

Madison County Schools (MCS) will offer these assessments at your child's home school during the school day beginning Monday, October 5 per the attached schedule (except for Old Town Middle). The school will communicate with you the time and location of testing for your child. You will recall the MCS Virtual Learning Guidelines (July 2020) state that students may be required to come to the school site for state testing. Be assured, testing will occur in an on-campus location which minimizes contact with the general school population while providing for the mitigation of COVID through the three "Ws": 1) Wear a face covering, 2) Wash/sanitize hands/desks, and 3) Watch your distance. Plan for testing to take up to two hours for each subject and students are welcome to bring non-subject specific reading materials as well as a refillable water bottle. On the day of testing, please monitor your child's health prior to sending them to his/her home school. You are encouraged to visit your child's home school website as well as contact your child's home school with questions. Additional support can be attained by e-mailing assessment@madison-schools.com.

We appreciate partnering with you to grow your child. The data collected from these two assessments helps your child's teacher(s) to make the best instructional decisions to support your child in reaching his/her full potential.


