What supplies do I need?

What do I do before I come to class? *Complete all homework. *Gather and bring ALL needed supplies.

*Keep notebook and supplies neat & organized.



How do I enter the classroom? • Enter quietly.

- Place any homework in your block's drawer.
- Sharpen your pencil.

• Get your make-up if you were absent. Getting



your make-up work is YOUR responsibility.

• Go to your seat immediately.





How do I begin class?

- * Be prepared to work everyday.
- * Have out all materials needed for the entire class period.
- * Immediately begin your daily Jagmark, journal, or quote analysis entry.



What is expected of me during class?

- Speak one at a time, raise your hand, and wait for permission to speak(unless it is a group discussion and then common sense rules apply).
- Do not interrupt the teacher to ask to leave the room. At this time, we have a scheduled restroom break during each block.

Who gets to help?

When errands are required, Mrs. McC will choose a student randomly. These students are the ones who are doing what they are supposed to be doing.

Can I leave the classroom? Only in the case of an emergency.

NEVER ask to leave the classroom during instruction unless it is dire. How do I leave the classroom at the end of the block?

- Finish and turn in any assignment in your colored box.
- Write down all your assignments daily and gather your belongings.
- Sanitize your desk as directed.
- I will dismiss you by row or group when class is over. I will dismiss you, not the bell.
- Leave your desk area and my room neat.
- Leave quietly and respectfully not shoving, running, or pushing past others.

Jagmarks

- Daily Grammar Practice (DGP) will be completed as your Jagmark much of the time.
- These skills practice editing, proofreading, usage, sentence building, parts of speech, and other related skills of study.
- Jagmarks will be asked for randomly for a grade.



Journal Entries



 Journal entries will be completed one or two days each week on average. These may be writing to a prompt or a quote

analysis.

- Each journal entry will be written in first ten minutes of class.
- Each entry must be a minimum of half a page.
- Entries must be numbered, dated, and kept in the Jagmarks tab in your binder.



• One will likely be counted as a major test grade each nine weeks period. You will choose the writing you want me to assess. You will choose your best.

Where do I find my homework assignments?

- Each week and/or day, homework assignments will be written on the monthly calendar located on the board.
- It is the student's responsibility to copy assignments down in their planner.

How will my assignments be graded?

- All work should be completed neatly in pencil or erasable pen.
- Always write your name, date, class period, AND NUMBER on your paper starting on the first line on the right hand side of the paper. Titles should be placed on first available line, centered. (A sample paper will be on display...please use it.)



• Students will lose points on their assignments for *incomplete sentences*, *sentence fragments*, *incorrect punctuation*, or *incorrect* spelling.

What do you do when you are absent?

Weekly Quiz

- Most Fridays you will be quizzed on the weekly objectives.
- These quizzes will include vocabulary, reading skills, grammar, or writing skills.



What about Independent Reading?

- Yes, you will be responsible for at least one independent NOVEL per nine weeks.
- At least 2 out of the 4 nine-weeks' periods, we will also read at least one class novel.
- Remember to <u>ALWAYS</u> bring your independent book to class to read when you are finished with an assignment.



Vocabulary

- Vocabulary lessons will be assigned weekly/daily.
- Students are not only responsible for the weekly/daily words, but also for the all preceding words previously covered. I will spiral back and catch previously studied words for the test.



Substitute Teacher

- You should follow all procedures just as if I was in the room.
- I'll assign two students to help the substitute with any questions.
- If for some reason I am away unexpectedly, please continue as if I were in the classroom.
- Penalties are doubled for anyone who chooses to break a rule while I am absent.



Classroom Discussions Asking Questions

- Please feel free to ask questions or join discussions.
- While each person is speaking, they should wait patiently and listen.
- Hands should only be up when the speaker is finished.
- Make all questions and comments relevant to the current discussion.
- If your question is off the topic, write it down and ask later.
- Each person will only be able to speak once during a discussion.
- When you begin an assignment, wait for me to walk around the room and I will answer your questions.
