
Meet the Author and Photographer Norbert Wu








giant jellyfish

Some animals must be in water to live. This sea slug can rest on rocks in the water.




crab

Some animals can live in water and on land. This crab can run and dig in the sand.




penguins

Sea lions can live where it is warm. They will nap on rocks in the sun.




It has flippers that help it swim fast. It can swim far.






sea star

moray eels


Some animals eat plants. Lots of them eat fish. Some will hunt for a snack with a pal.
