

Student Expectations

Traditional school days provide students with much structure—this is hard to replicate in virtual learning. For some students, the flexibility of learning online is a natural fit. - Make sure your device is fully charged and you are ready to work.

- Make sure your camera is turned on.
- Appropriate dress is expected. If in doubt, refer to the student handbook.
- Food should not be consumed during interactive lessons.
- Be focused, pay attention and be an active participant.
- Be respectful of airtime. Give others a chance to respond.
- Do not say or type anything that is unkind or inappropriate.
- Questions should be directed to your teacher first. If additional assistance is needed, the teacher will direct you to the appropriate contact person.
