Welcome to English 1! This course offers a survey of dominant literary genres- novels, short stories, poetry, and drama--- exposing students to a variety of authors and developing their skills in reading comprehension and textual analysis. Major works covered include Short Stories, **To Kill a Mockingbird, Animal Farm, and Romeo and Juliet.**

Students will write in the four major modes (description, narration, informational, persuasion) for a variety of occasions and purposes.

Daily supplies you need in class EVERY. SINGLE. DAY.
