2 CHAT ABOUT IT

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Giraffes

Giraffes are known for their long necks, skinny legs and spotted patterns. Baby giraffes are called calves and by the time they are a year old they are about 10 feet tall. Most giraffes will grow to be around 16-19 feet tall and weigh between 1,600-3,000 pounds. On the top of their heads giraffes

have two horns called *ossicones* that protect their heads from injury. They are shaped like a door-knob and can be up to 5 inches long. Giraffes like to eat leaves and twigs. Their long tongues help pull the leaves off of trees. In the wild most giraffes live in Africa. Giraffes travel in large groups. Animals like lions and leopards try to hunt giraffes but the giraffes are strong and powerful. Giraffes also have great vision so they can see danger and quickly run away.
