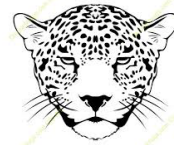

Grammar/Writing Skills:

Types of sentences: Statements (declarative) and Questions (interrogatives);
Writing answers to questions using complete sentences; Review of nouns;
Review of five parts of letters and commas used in letters

Shared Stories: The Three Little Pigs, Red Riding Hood, and various other fairy tales and folk tales.

Reading Skills:

The student will:

- Ask and answer who, what, when, where, when, and how questions about stories
- Summarize stories and determine the central message, lesson, or moral;
- Compare and contrast two or more versions of the same story by different authors or from different cultures.
- Learn the traits of a fairy tale.

Reading Vocabulary:

fairy tale, character, setting, trait, plot, conflict, moral

Math Skills:

- Place Value to 1,000
- One step Word Problems
- Writing numbers and number words to 100
- Expanded form ($125=100+20+5$)
- Review of even and odd
