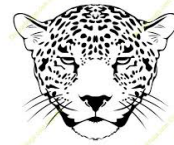

Statements (declaratives) are sentences that tell something and end with a period.

Questions (interrogatives) are sentences that ask something and end with a question mark.

Commands (Imperatives) are sentences that tell someone to do something and end with a period.

An exclamatory sentence is a sentence that shows strong feeling or surprise. It ends with an exclamation mark.
