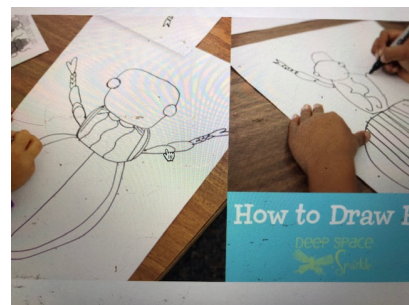




K-2 Art Plan for 3-23-20 to 3-27-20



Students will create a drawing of an insect aka bug of their choosing. The drawing must include a head, abdomen, thorax and six legs. The lines and shapes used can be designed by the student to make their bug or bugs look however they want.

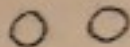
To help your child get inspired to draw an insect, log on to bookflix.digital.scholastic.com The username is malower and the password is bookflix. Once logged on, go to the Animals and Nature icon, there you will find a book called Bugs, Bugs, Bugs, click on that book cover to watch the video of the story. There are many types of insects displayed in the story. Your student can then draw a bug or insect of their own design.

If they need help getting started, the students can watch a video on Facebook on Wednesday, March 25th with a demonstration of the drawing technique by Mrs. Ramsey.

The students will need blank paper and a pencil to draw their bug/insect. The student can then use marker, crayon or watercolors(if available) to add color to their drawings. Students could also cut out their bugs and make a collage of their bugs by gluing them onto a piece of colored construction paper.

Please share your finished artwork on facebook so I can see how they turned out.

1. Draw two circles near the top of your paper.



2. Connect the circles (eyes) with a line, then draw a curved rectangle.



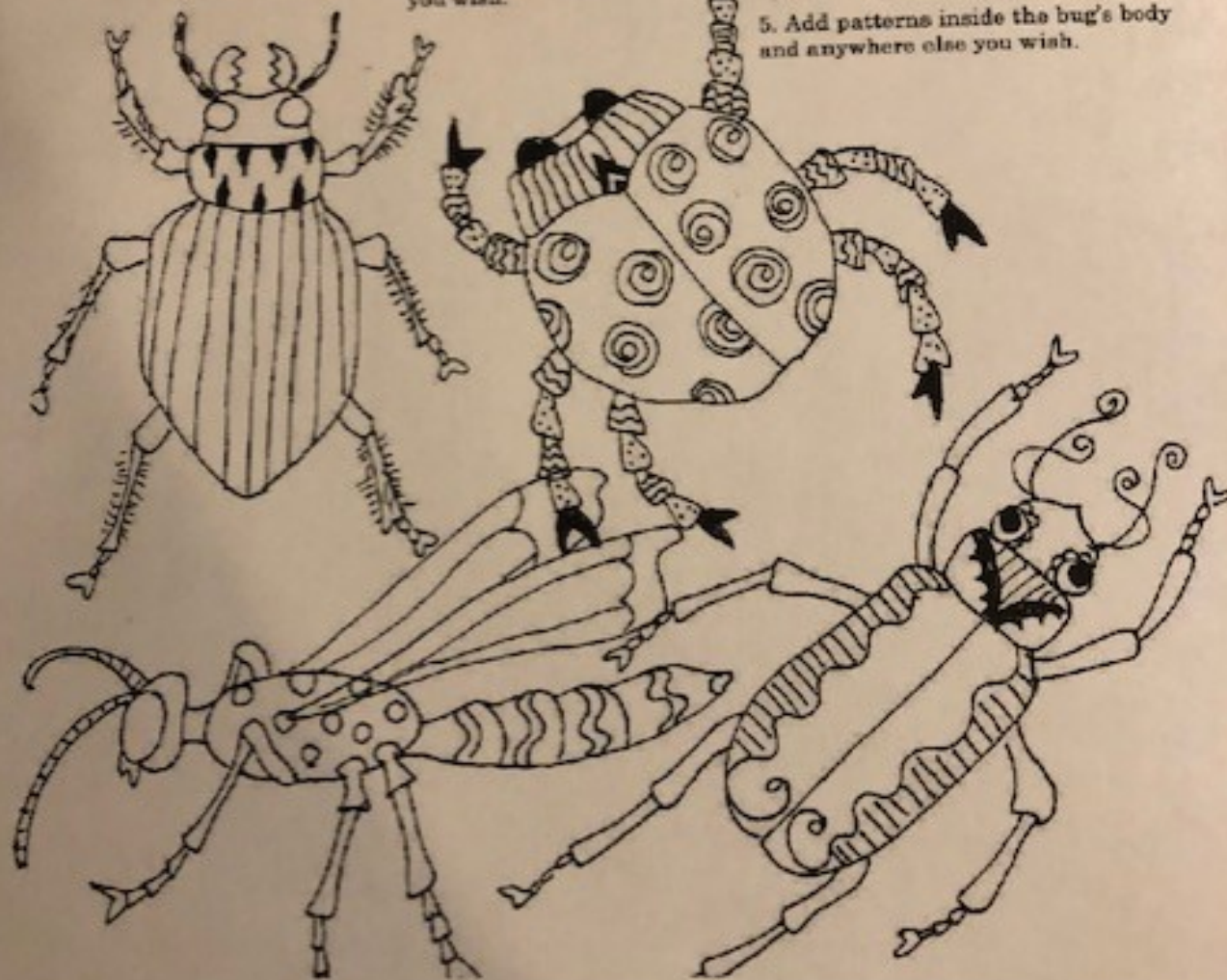
3. Connect the eyes to the "neck". Put your marker in the middle of the "neck" and draw a line as far down as you wish.



4. Draw the two sides of the body then add lots of legs! Remember, bugs are symmetrical: what you draw on one side, draw on the other.

5. Add patterns inside the bug's body and anywhere else you wish.
