

Guidelines for Remote Learning

Remote Learning is a year-long program intended for students diagnosed with a medical condition which prevents normal school attendance due to a compromised immune system. Students enrolled in Remote Learning may participate in school sponsored extra-curricular activities where virtual participation is feasible. Remote Learners may not participate in non-academic activities such as field trips. If the student's medical condition improves allowing the student to return to school, a medical clearance form must be submitted to <u>remote@madison-schools.com</u> If approved, the transition back to the school may only occur at the end of a nine-week grading period.

Application Process

Complete and submit Form A and Form B to <u>remote@madison-schools.com</u> no later than July 7, 2021. Forms may be accessed on the District website www.madison-schools.com.

Notification of the student's placement status will be sent to the parent's email provided on the application no later than July 26, 2021.

Program Overview

- Remote Learning will follow Madison County School's academic year calendar.
- All policies in the MCS Student Handbook will apply to remote learners.
- Core courses, English, math, science, and social studies will be offered however electives may not be included.
- Participation in Remote Learning may hinder earning credits and/or delay graduation.
- o All diploma requirements must be met for students to graduate.
- o Students must take benchmark and state assessments on campus.

Delivery of Instruction

- o Instruction will align with Madison County School's standards.
- Instruction will be provided by the teachers from student's assigned school.
- o Instructional content will be provided via Canvas/ Clever/ Edgenuity in lieu of scheduled live sessions.
- Virtual tutorial sessions will be provided by a supporting teacher weekly for elementary students, not to exceed four hours, and for secondary students bi-weekly, not to exceed four hours.
- Class assignments and homework will be submitted electronically. Paper packets will not be offered.

Support from Parent/ Guardian

- Provide reliable internet connectivity
- Ensure your child completes and submits assignments by established deadlines.
- Work with the supporting teacher to establish a designated time for tutorial sessions.
- Keep open lines of communication with your child's teacher(s).
- Enroll in Remind101 offered by your child's teacher.
- Notify your child's school with any changes in contact information.
- Complete and submit the Medical Clearance to Return to School form should your child's condition allow for return to school.
