Course Description: Cyber Foundations I is an innovative instructional program that prepares students to effectively use technology in learning, communication, and life. Students in Cyber Foundations complete study in interpersonal and self-directional skills; essential technology operations and technology concepts; social, ethical, and human issues in technology; technology communication tools; technology resource tools; multimedia presentation applications; word processing applications; spreadsheet applications; and design applications.

The year-end goal for Cyber Foundations I students in Madison County is to be able to touch type **32 net words per minute**. The students will be expected to **touch type** – this means without looking at the keyboard and with the keys covered – in class. All keyboarding assignments are to be completed IN CLASS, so we know WHO is typing, as well as if proper technique is being used. Just as with any skill – athletic, musical, artistic, etc. – perfect practice makes perfect. So, if you practice incorrectly, you will not master the skill, and your grade in keyboarding will reflect that!

...ENTERING THE CLASSROOM
